

**Another way to help is as easy as making a
two-minute phone call!**

New York's nursing homes, including The Friendly Home, are in a precarious financial condition. According to the New York Association of Homes & Services for the Aging (NYAHSA), it is estimated that the proposed 2011-2012 state budget presented by Governor Cuomo will result in a Medicaid revenue loss of \$786,000 to The Friendly Home.

In addition to sending a letter, please take just a few moments to call our state Senators and Assembly Members and urge them to reject the proposed budget cuts to nursing homes. It is crucial that you join the fight for a budget that preserves access to the quality care The Friendly Home provides and elderly New Yorkers deserve!

It's easy and quick:

1. Call the Senator and Assembly Member representing The Friendly Home and/or where you reside and ask to speak to the legislator. *(If you don't know who your legislators are, please visit the websites listed on the other side of this page where you can search by your home zip code. There is also a list of area representatives available at the Advocacy Center.)*
2. If the legislator is unavailable, tell the staff person you're calling regarding the state budget. Let them know you are a constituent, an employee, a volunteer, a caregiver or family member or friend of a constituent.
3. Use the phone script provided as a guide and ask for your Senator's and Assembly Member's support!

Phone Script—Proposed Budget Cuts for Nursing Homes

1. Introduction

Hello, this is (Name), a constituent in your district. May I please speak with (Name of Representative)?

- *If the legislator is not available, ask to speak to whoever handles legislation or leave a message.*

2. Issue

My name is (Name) and I am calling to ask you to reject Medicaid cuts aimed at nursing home residents in the proposed state budget. While New York must address a significant deficit, balancing the budget on the backs of the frail and elderly is not the answer. The Friendly Home and other nursing homes across the state are working to transform elder care and housing programs into senior-focused, flexible, engaging places to live, while reducing cost and the burden on the state. This budget proposal would throw most providers into chaos and cause them to focus simply on survival, not transformation that would benefit frail and elderly, and the state's fiscal health.

3. Closing

We need you to do everything you can to fight proposed nursing home funding cuts.
